Rules for Zone 7 All Star Teams

- 1) Shooter must be a member in good standing with NSSA and Zone 7 during the shooting year whose targets and averages are used to qualify for teams.
- 2) Shooter must be a resident of Zone 7 when the annual Zone 7 shoot is held
- 3) Shooter must have shot NSSA minimums established for that team. For Open Teams only, the following targets will NOT be considered for minimums or averages:
 - a) Monthly club targets
 - b) NSSA league targets
 - c) Small shoots where less than 4 shooters competed in any event
 - d) Non-competition targets, including but not limited to:
 - Added (extra) targets shot at a shoot that were not part of an event
 - Targets at shoots where no places were awarded.
 - Targets at shoots where shooter was not eligible to compete.
- 4) For Open Teams only, shooter must have completed 4 guns at prior year's zone shoot.
- 5) The following categories shall be awarded:
 - a) Open
 - b) Ladies
 - c) NSSA age concurrents
 - d) Active and retired military
 - e) Collegiate
 - f) Rookie
- 6) Qualified shooters within a category will be ranked according to their 4 gun average. Open team averages will be adjusted for non-qualifying targets.
- 7) If sufficient number of qualified shooters exists, a first team, second team and honorable mention team shall be recognized for the categories listed in item 5.
- 8) Shooter will be listed on the highest team he/she qualified for. Subsequent teams will be noted in as honors only but will be listed on the award given.
- Shooter making an Open Team will be considered for Captain of their concurrent team. However, no shooter making a higher team can prevent another shooter from being placed on a lesser ranked team.
- 10) Placement on a First Team outranks placement on a Second Team in a different category. If a shooter qualifies for placement on two first or two second teams, the category with the most competitors will rank highest.
- 11) No ranking will be considered for Collegiate or Rookie Teams.
